

Congratulations to our September iReady Math Champs for passing the most lessons from each of their grade levels. Keep up the great work!


From the Bourbon PTO

irtual Care, Weekend Clinic, or Emergency Care – What's the Difference?

Concerned about COVID-19 symptoms?

If you have concerns about COVID-19, log in or sign up for the MyChart patient health portal at

www.mypatientchart.org to use the online symptom checker. Based on your symptoms, medical conditions and other answers, this will help determine the appropriate level of care for you. If you would benefit from a COVID-19 e-visit or video visit, these will be offered, although there may be a fee for these visits.

If you need to be tested for COVID-19, there are multiple options in our region, and other non-emergency medical centers. Check with your local public health department, which often offers free testing options. You can also contact your primary care physician. For more information, visit https://health.mo.gov

The ER is not the best place to receive a COVID-19 test.

If you are experiencing a medical emergency, acute illness or severe COVID symptoms, seek immediate treatment at the emergency department.

In a world where there's not enough time in the day to be sick, we find ourselves wanting flexibility and more options for care when illness or injury strikes. But the choices can be confusing. Where do you go for an earache, a sprain, or something more serious, such as trouble breathing? What if these issues occur outside of your primary care provider's regular office hours? While the ER, virtual care and the Weekend Clinic aren't meant to replace visits to your doctor, they are there when you need to see someone during off hours, weekends, or more quickly than going to your physician.

BJC Medical Group recommends contacting your provider first when health concerns arise, unless it is a medical emergency. With the Missouri Baptist Sullivan Hospital and Bourbon School District's Partnership, students and staff have priority access to same day sick appointments when you aren't able to see your regular provider.

Virtual Care offers on-demand, same-day care without leaving home. A video visit allows you to connect face to face with a member of our Virtual Care team using the camera on your smartphone, tablet or computer and the cost is about what you would pay for a doctor's visit. Scheduled virtual visits are available with BJC Medical Group primary care physicians and participating specialists, and availability varies by specialty and office. Hours are from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. daily and can be requested through MyChart for users 12 and older. For more information, visit bjc.org/Virtual-Care.

Remember that virtual visits are for common conditions, not for emergency care.

Weekend Clinic at the Sullivan Medical Office is a non-emergency room setting offering patients, one-year and older, basic, quality medical care without the waiting time and higher costs associated with an ER visit. Most insurance plans are accepted with the standard office visit co-pay. The Weekend Clinic is located at 965 Mattox Drive, Sullivan, MO and is available Saturdays and Sundays from 10am-4pm. No appointment is necessary, however please call 573-860-6000 upon arrival for further instructions, prior to entering the building.

Common Injuries and Illnesses treated at the Sullivan Medical Office Weekend Clinic include:

- Bladder infections/Urinary tract
- infections (female)
- Breathing ailments (asthma) Bronchitis
- Colds
- Cough, sore throats
- Ear infections
- Fevers
- Sinus infections
- Stomach upset

- Swimmer's ear
- Abrasions
- Outs
- Fish hook removal
- Puncture wounds
- Insect bites
- Poison ivv
- Skin infections
- Skin rashes
- Sunhurns
- Emergency Rooms (ERs) are for more serious injuries or illness and are open around-the-clock. For a less severe injury or illness, the wait can be longer than with convenient care or urgent care and the cost higher. Of course, if the condition is lifethreatening, such as a heart attack, stroke, or if someone is unresponsive, call 911 immediately.

Use the ER for:

- Severe COVID-19 symptoms
 - Chest pain
 - Trouble breathing
 - Severe allergic reactions
 - Severe pain
 - Serious injury

- Sudden vision impairment
- Broken bones visible through the skin
- Severe burns
- Fainting
- Poisoning
- Rapid heartbeat
